



Good examples are crucial in an essay, but one must be careful to avoid sounding rather tedious with the repetition of 'for example' throughout all the paragraphs.

Consider the use of alternative connectors that can enhance the flow of your writing:

- (1) **To illustrate further**, China's use of surveillance technology in Xinjiang has led to the suppression of human rights for the Uighers.
- (2) **This view is clearly demonstrated** in the case of America's battle with fake news.
- (3) Singapore's vision of a Smart Nation is **a resounding proof** that technology can be harnessed for greater productivity and economic growth.
- (4) **A case in point** is the rise of the Black Lives Matter movement.
- (5) The surge of Covid-19 cases is **most evident** in countries that were either complacent or nonchalant.
- (6) **Such [absurdity] is portrayed** in how Trump's supporters refused to accept the results of the Presidential Elections.
- (8) The **most telling example** of this argument is the way populist leaders tout xenophobic views to instill fear in the people.
- (9) **One significant case study** is India's nation-wide identification programme called Aadhar which promises the collation of gigantic troves of data.
- (10) **Clearly**, the #metoo movement has sparked a wave of reforms in various countries, spurring both men and women to address the root causes of gender inequality.
